COUNCIL REPORTS

Councilman Bonanno stated that he met with Councilwoman Margolis, Council President Stern and the DPW. He felt it was a good meeting. The DPW did a great job with the storm. Our shredding event will take place on March 21, 2025. Christmas tree cleanup will end at the end of the month. There will be a meeting for the seniors at the Tice Senior Center on February 6, 2025, with Pat Schuber as the guest speaker. Regarding communications, our digital newsletter will be going out shortly.

Councilwoman Brodsky stated that we have two Shade Tree Ordinances on the agenda to be amended so that they can be consistent with each other. We will be having the naming and grand opening of the new park at the end of March. There will be a literacy program on zoom through Pascack Hills PFA on January 28, 2025, at 6:30 PM. Amanda Bickerstaff, CEO of AI for Educations, leads this informative 90-minute presentation. She will provide an overview of AI

and Generative Language Models, discuss their potential impact on education, give helpful tips and tricks for parents and offer guidance on how parents can support their children in using these tools responsibly and effectively.

Councilwoman Margolis stated she met with Councilwoman Marsh and the fire department regarding the Chili Cook-Off. It is scheduled for February 23rd at the fire house and there will be t-shirts this year. The fire department is looking to have fun events throughout the year. Councilwoman Margolis stated that she will be meeting with Councilman Bonanno regarding the Chamber of Commerce in the next few weeks. They are looking into having a Woodcliff Lake Historical Society. They are still working on having Cocoa with a Cop at the school. Councilwoman Margolis stated to Mayor Rendo that she would like to be on his Facebook live segment this year.

Councilwoman Marsh stated that we have an Affordable Housing Resolution on the Agenda this evening and that Council President Stern will be speaking about it more. Councilwoman Marsh wanted the residents to know that we chose this path, and we worked hard to produce a plan for the Fourth Round Affordable Housing Obligation. Our professionals worked hard to get our number to where it should be. Our Land Use Board will be meeting tomorrow evening at 7PM at Borough Hall if anyone is interested in attending. You can also watch it on zoom. There was a preliminary site approval for 240 Broadway by the Land Use Board. More information can be found on our website. We are still working with developers regarding this application. The Board took the public's feelings, concerns, and opinions very seriously. The Board is committed to making sure that every resident is heard.

Councilman Pollack stated that there are two Resolutions on the Agenda for the police department. This is to get the interview process started for new hires. PSE&G installed two light poles at the lower portion of the train station on Sunday. Councilman Pollack thanked Councilman Stern for pushing this matter to get it done. We are also looking to repair the lower portion of the train station parking lot. We will be meeting at the end of the week regarding the Capital Budget. The Board of Health had its Reorganization Meeting last week. Congratulations to Raphael Maurrasse for becoming Chairman of the Board and Josephine Higgins as Vice Chairman. The flyer went out regarding the Rabies Clinic and pet licensing. Our rabies clinic will take place on April 26, 2025, in front of Borough Hall. It will be held in the fire department if it rains. More information can be found on our website.

Council President Stern stated that there were two light poles installed at our train station. He wanted to thank Administrator Tom Padilla for helping with this. The cost would have been \$100,000 per pole if the town had to do it. Mr. Padilla made some calls and got it done. Council President Stern also wanted to thank Tom for stepping up to the plate. He had just lost his dad and was on bereavement leave but joined in on a zoom meeting regarding Affordable Housing. Council President Stern stated that he and Councilwoman Marsh have been asked numerous times why we did not join the Montvale lawsuit against the Affordable Housing Obligation. Montvale just filed a second order to show cause, and it was rejected for the second time. It did not make legal sense for Woodcliff Lake to join it.

Mayor Rendo stated Administrator Padilla, Councilman Pollack, Council President Stern, and himself engaged with our professionals to have a traffic study done at the intersection of Woodcliff and Werimus. Administrator Padilla will be meeting in February with the county and our engineer to discuss the study. The study recommends that a traffic signal be installed at this intersection. Councilman Stern stated that he is going to try and push for the light at Highview be moved at the meeting.

Mayor Rendo stated that he attended the Pascack Valley Chamber of Commerce meeting and Assemblyman Robert Auth was there. If the Borough has any transportation projects requests, we should contact Assemblyman Auth because DOT grants could be available. Mayor Rendo thanked Council President Stern and Councilwoman Marsh for working so hard on Resolution No. 25-55.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Administrator Padilla thanked Council President Stern for his kind words. Administrator Padilla stated that he worked for many years in public service and formed many relationships. He tries to leverage any relationship that he must to help the town. He also stated that we are successful due to the staff. Our department heads, Debbie Dakin, Chief Regula, Captain Malloy, David Linko, Kevin Zink, and Rob Kuehlke do a great job.

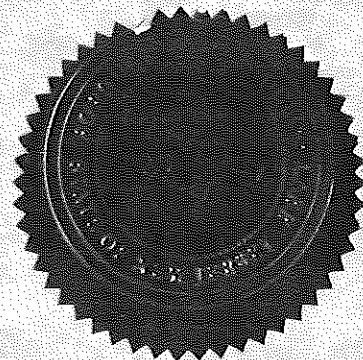

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, Monday, January 27, 2025, is International Holocaust Remembrance Day, which marks the eightieth anniversary of the liberation of the Auschwitz concentration camp; and

WHEREAS, this is a day of remembrance for the six million Jews who were murdered by Nazi Germany between 1933 and 1945; and

WHEREAS, on this anniversary, the Borough of Woodcliff Lake recommits itself to combating the global rise in anti-Semitism; and

WHEREAS, on May 26, 2016, thirty-one member states of the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance (IHRA), of which the United States is a member, adopted a non-legally binding "working definition" of anti-Semitism; and

WHEREAS, the working definition reads as follows: "Antisemitism is a certain perception of Jews, which may be expressed as hatred toward Jews. Rhetorical and physical manifestations of antisemitism are directed toward Jewish or non-Jewish individuals and/or their property, toward Jewish community institutions and religious facilities;" and

WHEREAS, anti-Semitic attacks are an assault on the humanity of all people, and we should always take time to remember the millions of men, women and children who were killed simply because of their beliefs and their heritage, and we must avow that the atrocities and genocide of the Holocaust never be repeated.

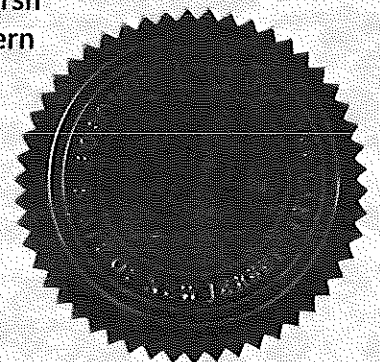

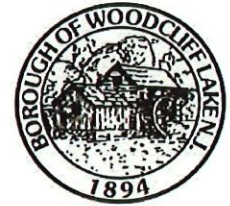

JANUARY ENGINEERS REPORT
BOROUGH OF WOODCLIFF LAKE
JANUARY 24, 2025



1. Galaxy Gardens Civil Design and NJDEP Land Use Permitting

Project awarded to Applied Landscape for the total contract amount of \$2,753,123.00. Change Order No. 1 for Monument Area add-on and associated sitework in the amount of \$97,855.47 (3.55%) was approved by the Borough per Resolution No. 24-259. The sitework, grading, drainage, walkways, lighting, and landscaping improvements are substantially complete. The restroom building structure is substantially complete. Remaining items include the installation of the bandshell structure, pavilion structure, sign structure, and the CO #1 monument area work. Anticipated delivery of the bandshell, pavilion, and sign structure is the end of January 2025. Contractor is working toward final project completion for early Spring 2024 for a Borough ribbon cutting/opening (March 22 target date) and coordinated with the Borough.

2. Werimus Lane Bypass Chamber Improvements

Neglia completed plans and specifications for the Phase I - Werimus Lane Bypass Chamber Improvements to address immediate public health and safety needs at the existing Werimus Lane sewage pumping station at this time. Construction of the bypass chamber system is substantially complete. Startup and testing of system to occur within next 2 weeks to be coordinated with the Borough.

3. Werimus Lane Pump Station Flood Resilient Improvements

Bids were opened on December 5, 2024 and reviewed by our office. Award recommendation package provided to Borough on 12/6/2024 recommending award of a contract to J.Fletcher Creamer and Sons for the amount of \$1,892,500.00 which was the lowest of four (4) bids submitted. Preconstruction meeting was held January 21 2025. Contractor proceeding with submittals to secure long lead time items with anticipated groundbreaking construction to occur in June following school closure.

4. Campbell Avenue Paving Project NJDOT MA-2023 & Year 2023 Municipal Paving Project

The Borough of Woodcliff Lake received a grant in the amount of \$203,110.00 from the NJDOT for Campbell Avenue Paving Project as per the November 23, 2022 grant award letter. Project awarded to D&L Paving in the amount of \$551,105.11 for the Base Bid and Alternates A, B, C, and D for Campbell Avenue (NJDOT), Birchwood Road, Stacey Court, Renee Court, and Manhole Reconstructions. Preconstruction meeting was held on 6/6/2024. Birchwood Road drainage has been completed. Paving of Campbell Avenue, Stacey Court, Renee Court was completed. Birchwood Road has been temporarily restored with asphalt with final paving to occur in Spring 2025 following the settlement period of the drainage pipe trenching.

5. **Werimus Road/Old Mill/Woodcliff Avenue Traffic Signal Warrant Analysis**

Neglia completed and provided the Traffic Signal Warrant Analysis to the Borough and County of Bergen for review. Traffic study/signal warrant analysis is under review by Bergen County and Neglia is following up for a conference call meeting with Borough and County.

6. **MS4 Stormwater Mapping & MS4 Assistance Grant, MS4 Updated MSWP**

Neglia provided a proposal for MS4 Stormwater Mapping to address the latest NJDEP MS4 Regulations to the Borough. Neglia is prepared to proceed with the MS4 Stormwater Mapping once our proposal is approved/authorized by the Borough. This mapping needs to be completed and submitted by **January 1, 2026** for Borough MS4 Compliance. We need this proposal authorized asap in order to have sufficient time to complete the work for the January 1, 2026 NJDEP deadline as we estimate it will take approximately 8-12 months to complete the MS4 Stormwater Mapping.

Neglia provided a proposal to prepare a revised Municipal Stormwater Management Plan (MSWMP) as required by the NJDEP. The Borough's MSWP is from 2005 and the NJDEP requires the plan be updated at a minimum once every 10 years based on the most current Stormwater Control Ordinance (SCO).

7. **Broadway Corridor Streetscape Improvement Project (NJDOT MA-2024)**

The Borough of Woodcliff Lake received a grant in the amount of \$233,364.00 from the NJDOT for the Broadway Corridor Streetscape Improvements Project (Prospect to Campbell) as per the November 1, 2023 NJDOT grant award letter. Neglia has provided a proposal for the Engineering Design and Construction Management for review & execution by the Borough in order to stay on track with the NJDOT MA 2024 award deadline of **October 31, 2025**. Neglia is prepared to proceed with the survey, design, and NJDOT PMRS pre-bid submissions once our proposal is approved/authorized by the Borough.

8. **NJDOT FY2025 Grant – West Hill Road**

Borough received a FY25 NJDOT MA Grant in the amount of \$133,035.00 for the repaving of West Hill Road in accordance with the Grant Application submitted. Neglia will provide a proposal for survey, design, NJDOT submissions, construction management and project administration for the Borough to complete the project in accordance with Grant. Project needs to be awarded by October 2026.

9. **Future Paving Projects & Road Selections**

Preliminary Engineer's estimates for Brookview Drive, Borough Hall Parking Lot and Drainage improvements, Evan Court, West Hill Road, and additional Manhole Reconstructions provided to Borough for review. Neglia will provide a formal proposal to the Borough for survey, design, and bid documents for the Year 2025 Paving Program once final road selections are made and project scope confirmed.

10. Old Barn Site and Train Station Parking Lot (North Side)

Neglia completed pre-bid review agency submissions to NJ Transit, Bergen County, Veolia, and the NJDEP. The 90th day on the NJDEP Land Use Application is March 18, 2025 however the NJDEP typically requests and additional 30 days on most applications. Neglia proceeding with final design plans and specifications so that the project is ready for bidding following receipt of the NJDEP permit and Borough approval of the same.

11. Woodcliff Lake Tennis Courts

Neglia understands that the Borough of Woodcliff Lake intends to pursue upgrades to the existing tennis court complex locate within Block 1401 Lot 5 in the Borough of Woodcliff Lake. We understand the Borough would like to reconstruct/reconfigure the existing (6) tennis courts with a new design to include pickleball courts, tennis courts, and a basketball court subject to review and approval by the Borough. As per a field visit and preliminary review and discussions with the Borough, we understand that there are concerns with drainage at the property and a portion of the Musquapsink Brook flows thru the northeast corner of the property per available mapping.

Neglia is proceeding with the survey and preliminary engineering concept plan in accordance with our proposal and Resolution 24-236. Survey was completed by Neglia and preliminary concept plan will be provided by the end the month.

12. Digital Tax Maps

Neglia provided a proposal to the Borough for Surveying and GIS services to provide updated Digital Tax maps to meet all current NJ Regulations and Standards as requested.

13. Woodcliff Avenue & Woodcliff Middle School Drainage Improvements

As requested, Neglia provided a proposal to the Borough for survey, design, and NJDEP Land Use permitting to perform a drainage study for the purposes of designing proposed drainage improvements to address storm drainage conveyance issues and concerns upstream and downstream of Woodcliff Avenue that are adversely impacting the Woodcliff Middle School property for review by the Borough and for coordination with the Borough, School, and County of Bergen.

14. Musquapsink Brook/Old Mill Road Area Wide Drainage Study

Neglia met with the Borough to review flood damage and erosion near the intersection of Old Mill Road, Werimus Road, and Woodcliff Avenue following the August 3 cloudburst storm event. Neglia provided a proposal for an Area Wide Drainage Study of the Musquapsink Brook centered at the Old Mill Road/Werimus Road, and Woodcliff Avenue intersection to analysis the existing conditions both upstream and downstream of the existing culvert to provide recommendations for pro-active measures to improve drainage.

15. Glen Road Bridge (NJDOT & Municipal Funded)

Replacement of the Glen Road Bridge over Bear Brook was completed and the bridge re-opened in May 2024 in accordance with plans and specifications prepared by Neglia. NJDOT Grant closeout documentation has been submitted to NJDOT and is under review for final grant reimbursement.

16. Glen Road Improvements Project NJDOT FY 2022

The Borough of Woodcliff Lake received a grant in the amount of \$206,000.00 from the NJDOT to be utilized towards the repaving of a portion Glen Road. Bids opened on 8/9/2023 and the project was awarded to Macchione Paving as per resolution no. 23-186 for \$239,937.75. Paving was completed, NJDOT inspection completed, and asphalt core testing was completed and acceptable. Maintenance Bond and Borough closeout package provided to the Borough on 12/2/2024. Neglia proceeding with NJDOT closeout for final reimbursement.

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 70 ENTITLED "SHADE TREE COMMITTEE" OF THE
BOROUGH CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF WOODCLIFF LAKE, STATE OF NEW JERSEY**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF WOODCLIFF LAKE IN
THE COUNTY OF BERGEN AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, Chapter 70, of the Code of the Borough of Woodcliff Lake sets forth all regulations
regarding Shade Tree Committee within the Borough of Woodcliff Lake; and,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Woodcliff Lake, County of Bergen
and State of New Jersey that those portions of the aforesaid set forth below are hereby amended
as follows and that those portions of the Ordinance not set forth below shall remain unchanged.

Ch. 70. Shade Tree Committee

Sec. 70-6. Costs of planting and removal of trees.

Except as hereinafter provided, the initial cost of trees planted by the Borough at the
recommendation of the Committee, the cost of planting then, the cost of posts, boxes or guards
used for the protection thereof, shall be the responsibility of the Borough. The cost of removal
of any trees dangerous to public safety shall be the responsibility of the owner of the property as
set forth in Chapter 326-31 of the Borough Code.

Severability. All provisions of this Ordinance are severable. If for any reason, any provision of this
Ordinance is held to be invalid, the validity of the remainder of the Ordinance shall not be affected.

Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon final approval and publication,
pursuant to law, and upon completion of all outstanding cases.

ORDINANCE NO. 25-02

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 326 ENTITLED "STREETS AND SIDEWALKS" OF THE BOROUGH CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF WOODCLIFF LAKE, STATE OF NEW JERSEY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF WOODCLIFF LAKE IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, Chapter 326, of the Code of the Borough of Woodcliff Lake sets forth all regulations regarding Streets and Sidewalks within the Borough of Woodcliff Lake; and,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Woodcliff Lake, County of Bergen and State of New Jersey that those portions of the aforesaid set forth below are hereby amended as follows and that those portions of the Ordinance not set forth below shall remain unchanged.

Ch. 326. Streets and Sidewalks

Sec. 326-31. Obstructions.

(a) Removal of Dead Trees and Branches.

Owners of property abutting on any street or public right-of-way and/or easement are required to trim or remove trees in the public right-of-way and/or easement, contiguous to their property or on their property which encroaches into the public right-of-way and/or easement with the exception of trees and/or branches that fall into the street causing a dangerous condition which will be the Borough's responsibility to remove. Trees with dead or overhanging branches are a potential hazard to people and/or motor vehicles and are required to be trimmed or removed. The municipality shall provide written notice to the property owner by posting notice on any tree that is to be trimmed or removed and shall be either sent to the property owner by certified mail, return receipt requested or personally served upon an occupant of the property of the age of 14 years or older. The notice shall give the property owner a period of time of at least ten (10) days or a shorter period of time if necessary for public safety, to trim or remove the trees and or branches. If the property owner does not trim or remove the trees or branches after a period of at least ten (10) days, or a shorter period of time if necessary for public safety, the municipality shall do so at the property owner's expense. The cost of trimming or removing the trees shall become a lien on that property and shall be included in the next tax bill rendered to the property owner. Same shall be collected in the same manner as other taxes against that property.

Severability. All provisions of this Ordinance are severable. If for any reason, any provision of this Ordinance is held to be invalid, the validity of the remainder of the Ordinance shall not be affected.

Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon final approval and publication, pursuant to law, and upon completion of all outstanding cases.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF WOODCLIFF LAKE, BERGEN COUNTY, COMMITTING TO THE BOROUGH'S FOURTH ROUND AFFORDABLE HOUSING OBLIGATION

RESOLUTION NO. 25-55 JANUARY 27, 2025

WHEREAS, on March 20, 2024, Governor Philip D. Murphy signed into law, a Bill commonly known as A4/S50 or P.L. 2024, c.2, which amended the Fair Housing Act (N.J.S.A. 52:27D-301 et seq.) (hereinafter the "4th Round Rules"); and

WHEREAS, the 4th Round Rules abolished the Council on Affordable Housing, also known as COAH, and delegated its responsibilities to the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs (hereinafter "DCA"), the New Jersey Housing and Mortgage Finance Agency, and the Affordable Housing Dispute Resolution Program (hereinafter "Program"), ordered to be formed by the same law; and

WHEREAS, the 4th Round Rules requires the DCA to calculate and publish, not later than October 20, 2024, non-binding estimates of fair share obligations, comprised of the Present Need or Rehabilitation Obligation and a Prospective Need or New Construction Obligation, for each municipality in the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the Prospective Need represents the need for newly constructed or preserved affordable housing units projected over the next 10 years, calculated for "regions" consisting of three to four counties and allocated to each municipality based on three (3) factors to allocate the Regional Need to each applicable municipality: equalized non-residential valuation, income capacity, and land capacity; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Woodcliff Lake is located in Region 1, identified in the 4th Round Rules as consisting of all municipalities in Bergen, Hudson, Passaic, and Sussex Counties; and

WHEREAS, the Present Need represents the need for rehabilitation of substandard homes in the municipality, occupied by low- and moderate-income households, based upon publicly available local estimates of housing that lacks adequate plumbing or kitchens, is overcrowded, is more than 50 years old, and is likely to be occupied by low- and moderate-income households; and

WHEREAS, the DCA issued a report on October 18, 2024 (“DCA Report”) wherein it reported its estimate of the obligation for all municipalities based upon its interpretation of the standards in the 4th Round Rules; and

WHEREAS, the DCA Report calculates the Round 4 (2025-2035) obligation of the Borough of Woodcliff Lake (“Borough”), as follows: a Present Need or Rehabilitation Obligation of 0 and a Prospective Need or New Construction Obligation of 423; and

WHEREAS, the 4th Round Rules provides that the DCA Report is non-binding, thereby inviting municipalities to demonstrate that the 4th Round Rules would support lower calculations of Round 4 affordable housing obligations; and

WHEREAS, the 4th Round Rules further provides that “[a]ll parties shall be entitled to rely upon regulations on municipal credits, adjustments, and compliance mechanisms adopted by COAH unless those regulations are contradicted by statute, including P.L. 2024, c.2, or binding court decisions” (N.J.S.A 52:27D-311(m)); and

WHEREAS, COAH regulations authorize vacant land adjustments as well as durational adjustments; and

WHEREAS, the DCA has released a Geographic Information Systems spatial data representation of the Land Capacity Analysis for P.L. 2024, c.2 containing the Vacant and Developable land information that serves as the basis for calculating the land capacity factor; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Woodcliff Lake’s affordable housing planner, DMR Architects, has reviewed the lands identified by the DCA for the land capacity factor with respect to the MOD-IV Property Tax List data, construction permit data, land use board approvals, configuration, and accessibility to ascertain whether these identified developable lands may accommodate development; and

WHEREAS, DMR Architects has identified an error in the DCA’s land capacity analysis whereby the DCA correctly removed land within the 300 feet of a Category-One (C1) linear water

bodies but failed to measure appropriate buffers around C1-rated lakes, ponds, or reservoirs such as the Woodcliff Lake Reservoir and Holdrum Brook Pond, which are also subject to the 300-foot buffer requirement; and

WHEREAS, applying the most recently published American Community Service (“ACS”) data for the 5-year period of 2018 to 2023 to the DCA’s Methodology Workbook for Income Allocation Factor reduces the allocation factor from 1.61% to 1.39%; and

WHEREAS, after excluding lands that were inaccurately determined by the DCA to be developable and adjusting the income data, the Borough calculated its Round 4 obligation to include a Present Need or Rehabilitation Obligation of 0 and a Prospective Need or New Construction Obligation of 329 units as noted in DMR Architects’ analysis attached herewith as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the 4th Round Rules provides the “municipality’s determination of its fair share obligation shall have a presumption of validity, if established in accordance with sections 6 and 7” of the Act; and

WHEREAS, the Borough’s calculation of its Round 4 obligation was calculated in accordance with sections 6 and 7 of the 4th Round Rules and is therefore entitled to a presumption of validity; and

WHEREAS, the 4th Round rules, as written at Section 23 of P.L.2024, c.2 (C.52:27D-310.1), allow built-out communities to seek an adjustment of their Prospective Need obligations based on a lack of vacant, available, and environmentally unconstrained land on which to build new homes, called a vacant land adjustment, with the caveat that any municipality seeking a vacant land adjustment shall be required to prepare a Housing Element and Fair Share Plan providing for the satisfaction of not less than 25% of its 329 unit Prospective Need , or 83 units; and

WHEREAS, DMR Architects conducted an analysis according to the 4th Round rules and methodologies, and concluded that the Borough of Woodcliff Lake has a realistic development potential of less than 83 units, based upon vacant and available land, before accounting for the 25% minimum; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board of Woodcliff Lake Borough shall adopt not later than June 30, 2025 a Housing Element and Fair Share Plan addressing its Prospective and Present Needs, with the Prospective Need to be adjusted to not less than 83 units based upon a lack of vacant land, pursuant to section 23 of P.L.2024, c.2 (C.52:27D-310.1); and

WHEREAS, the 4th Round Rules require that every municipality adopt before January 31, 2025, and upload onto a website created for the Program within 48 hours of adoption, a binding resolution identifying their affordable housing obligations; and

WHEREAS, the Borough reserves the right to comply with any additional amendments to the 4th Round Rules that the Legislature may enact; and

WHEREAS, the Borough also reserves the right to adjust its position in the event of any rulings in the Montvale case (MER-L-1778-24) or any other such action that alters the deadlines and/or requirements of the 4th Round Rules; and

WHEREAS, in the event that a third party challenges the calculations provided for in this Resolution, the Borough of Woodcliff Lake reserves the right to take such position as it deems appropriate in response thereto, including that its Round 4 Prospective Need Obligation should be lower than described herein; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the foregoing, nothing in the 4th Round Rules requires or can require an increase in the Borough's Round 4 Present or Prospective Need Obligations based on a successful downward challenge of any other municipality in the region since the plain language and clear intent of the 4th Round Rules is to establish, for example, unchallenged numbers by default on March 1, 2025; and

WHEREAS, in light of the above, the Mayor and Council find that it is in the best interest of the Borough of Woodcliff Lake to declare its modifications to the obligations reported by the DCA on October 18, 2024 subject to the reservations set forth herein; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Directive #14-24, a municipality seeking a certification of compliance with the Fair Housing Act shall file an action in the form of a declaratory judgment complaint in the county in which the municipality is located within 48 hours after adoption of the municipal resolution of fair share obligations, or by February 3, 2025, whichever is sooner"; and

WHEREAS, the Borough seeks a certification of compliance with the Fair Housing Act and, therefore, directs its Affordable Housing Counsel to file a declaratory relief action within 48 hours of the adoption of this resolution in Bergen County.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE FOLLOWING SHALL BE RESOLVED, by the Council of the Borough of Woodcliff Lake, Bergen County, New Jersey on this 27th day of January 2025:

1. All of the above Whereas Clauses are incorporated into the operative clauses of this resolution.

2. For the reasons set forth in this resolution, the Borough of Woodcliff Lake commits to a Round 4 Present Need obligation of 0 units and a Round 4 Prospective Need obligation of 329 based on the calculations set forth in Exhibit A, subject to all reservations of all rights, which specifically include, without limitation, the following:
 - a. The right to a vacant land adjustment and any other adjustment in accordance with COAH regulations;
 - b. The right to adjust its fair share obligations in the event of any future legislation that changes its obligations under current law;
 - c. The right to adjust its obligations based upon any ruling in the Montvale case (MER-L-1778-24) or any other litigation; and
 - d. The right to adjust its obligations in the event of a third-party challenge to the fair share obligations set forth by the DCA
3. The Borough's Affordable Housing Counsel, within 48 hours of the passing of this resolution, file a declaratory judgment complaint in Bergen County in order to maintain the Borough's immunity from exclusionary zoning litigation.
4. The Borough authorizes its Affordable Housing Counsel to attach this resolution as an exhibit to the declaratory judgment action that is filed and to submit and/or file this resolution with the Program or any other such entity as may be determined to be appropriate.
5. The Borough Clerk shall publish the filing materials and this resolution on a publicly accessible page of the Borough's website.
6. The Borough shall undertake all acts necessary to adopt, not later than June 30, 2025, a Housing Element and Fair Share Plan addressing its Prospective and Present Needs, with the Prospective Need to be adjusted to not less than 83 units based upon a lack of vacant land, pursuant to section 23 of P.L.2024, c.2 (C.52:27D-310.1)
7. This resolution shall take effect immediately, according to law.
