CALL TO ORDER

Notice of this meeting in accordance with the "Open Public Meetings Law, 1975, C. "231" was posted at Borough Hall and two newspapers, The Record and The Ridgewood News, were notified.

Chief Kuehlke gave a brief synopsis of the events that happened on March 10, 2025. Late

afternoon/early evening started out with a call for a dumpster fire. While wrapping things up at the dumpster fire, a call came in regarding a school bus that had rolled over on the Parkway with multiple people trapped. They immediately headed towards the Parkway and were the first squad on scene. They assessed the situation and began lifting the bus up to remove the individual trapped beneath the school bus. With the help of everyone on scene, they were able to retrieve the individual trapped beneath the bus and get him into the ambulance to be transported to the hospital.

Councilwoman Margolis thanked the firefighters. First responders help our neighbors and our families and always put others before themselves. They are volunteers and we are so appreciative and thank you for all you do.

Council President Stern stated that the fire department always steps up. They take time away from their families, children and spouses for us, our families, and our friends. We are truly grateful.

PUBLIC COMMENT

(limited to 3 minutes per speaker)

MOTION to open to the public was made by Councilwoman Marsh, second by Councilwoman Brodsky and unanimously approved.

Josephine Higgins, Woodcliff Lake, stated that the Arbor Day celebration will take place at 9AM on Friday at the school. Josephine Higgins thanked Clay Bosch for all his hard work and dedication to the Shade Tree Committee. Ms. Higgins stated that she appointed Clay Bosch in 1996 when she was Mayor. Ms. Higgins asked when the items from the VFW would be brought to the new park. Administrator Padilla replied that he will take her to the new park tomorrow and show her where they are going to go. Ms. Higgins asked what improvements are going to be made to the old barn site. Councilman Pollack replied that the retaining wall is going to be replaced, the parking lot will be repaved, and we will be taking down the rest of the foundation. Ms. Higgins stated that the fire department is excellent.

Bert Taylor, Woodcliff Lake, asked how the Mayor and Council gets the list of items that they will be voting on. Council President Stern explained the process. Council President Stern stated that we have six members of the Council that are fully committed and dedicated and actively involved. We have a lot of Committees that meet and then fill in the other Council members. Administrator Padilla stated that each Council member is on certain Committees. The Mayor and Council President set the Agenda. Mr. Taylor asked what improvements are going to be made to the tennis and pickleball area. Mr. Taylor also asked about when the speed limit on Werimus Road was going to be changed. It was determined that Mr. Taylor was reading the Engineer's Report and not the Resolutions on the Agenda. This was explained to Mr. Taylor. Mr. Taylor wanted to know why we were not going with the food vendor that would pay the Borough the most. Administrator Padilla replied that the Borough did their due diligence and went with the most responsible vendor.

MOTION to close to the public was made by Councilman Pollack, second by Councilwoman Brodsky and unanimously approved.

COUNCIL REPORTS

Councilwoman Marsh stated that the Land Use Board met last evening. There was two Area in Need of Redevelopment reports and a Power Point presentation given. Both can be found on the website. Both properties met the standards for an area in need of redevelopment. It was approved by the Land Use Board last night. There should be a Resolution at the next Land Use Board meeting and then will be presented to the Mayor and Council. Please reach out to the Mayor and Council if you have any questions or comments. There is a Resolution from the Mayor and Council for the Land Use Board to do another area in need of redevelopment study for 240 Broadway. There was some confusion at the Land Use Board meeting last night regarding speaking at the meeting. If you have any comments, you must be present at the meeting. Question and comments will not be accepted over Zoom. Zoom is for viewing only. That information is on the Notice.

Councilman Pollack stated at on Saturday we will have our Rabies Clinic at Borough Hall, rain, or shine, from 10AM to 12PM. You may also sign up for pool, camp, tennis, and ecology permits. There is a Resolution on the Agenda to auction off some Borough vehicles that are not being used anymore. Council President Stern and Councilman Pollack met with the police candidates and

are happy with the three officers that we will be hiring this evening. On May 21, 2025, at 5:30 PM we will have our Budget presentation. Council President Stern, Councilman Pollack, Councilman Bonanno, and Administrator Padilla worked very hard on this budget and went through every line item. We are very confident about what is being proposed.

Councilman Bonanno stated that pool, camp, and tennis registration is open. Grace Frangiosa is coming back as Camp Director. The scoreboards for the ballfields were ordered and purchased by a grant. Jack's Café will run our concession stand for the pool and camp. DPW did an excellent job with getting the fields ready for opening day. Please look at our new signs at the pool.

Councilwoman Brodsky stated that Friday is Arbor Day at the Middle School at 9:00 AM which is also Clay Bosch Day. We thank Clay for his service and leadership. This is our 19th year as Tree City USA. Thank you to Marilyn Clark for her dedication and commitment to the Shade Tree Committee. There will be a cleanup on Sunday from 1:00 PM to 3:00 PM at the free farm and community garden. On May 3, 2025, at 1:30 we will have ribbon cutting at our new park. There will be a commemorative giveaway while supplies last. On May 17, 2025, Spring Fest will take place at our new park. On May 31, 2025, there will be Reservoir Cleanup. October will be our Health and Wellness month. Our High School's annual Fashion Show will take place tomorrow evening.

Councilwoman Margolis stated that there is a Film Read Resolution on the Agenda tonight. This is the third of five steps. We just received a comprehensive list of businesses from our fire prevention department. This will help us with establishing a Chamber of Commerce. On May 1, 2025, there will be a Senior Health Day at Tice Senior Center and on June 5, 2025, the Seniors will have their Summer Party.

Councilman Pollack stated that the reservoir trails opened, and you could register for a key on the Veolia website.

Council President Stern stated that Ordinance No. 25-04 restricts Borough parking lots to residents only. David Linko was hired as Superintendent at DPW in January. David works very hard, and Council President Stern does not have one regret with promoting David. He runs a tight ship and is diligent. We will be hiring an additional two DPW workers tonight. Councilman Pollack stated that there are currently three non-residents that have parking permits. Administrator Padilla stated that they are good for this year but going forward it will not be permitted.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Administrator Padilla stated that this is the fourth year that the Pool Management Company will be with us as a vendor. We will be meeting with them tomorrow with the Park and Recreation Committee.

PUBLIC HEARING – OPEN SPACE TRUST FUND MUNICIPAL PARK IMPROVEMENTS – TENNIS COURTS

Administrator Padilla stated that the Woodcliff Lake Tennis Court Improvement Project will include the complete reconstruction of the existing courts. This will include site clearing, grading, and new asphalt surfacing, as well as new fencing, sports lighting, court striping for tennis, basketball, and pickleball, courts, and the installation of upgraded netting and posts. Additional upgrades include a landscaped rain garden, a pedestrian path, and courtyard hardscape improvements to enhance accessibility and aesthetics.

The scope of work for the Woodcliff Lake Tennis Court Improvements includes the full-depth reconstruction of three tennis courts, three pickleball courts, and one basketball court. Work will involve the demolition of existing surfaces, site grading, installation of dense graded aggregate base, and the placement of hot mix asphalt base and surface courses. Each court will receive new surface coatings, appropriate striping, and installation of court-specific equipment including netting, posts, and basketball goals. Additional improvements include the addition of new chain link fencing, complete with sound attenuation, concrete curbing, a hardscape courtyard with seating, drainage system upgrades, and landscaping features such as a rain garden and topsoil restoration.

The project also involves the reconstruction of the Rinzler Memorial Field pedestrian path. This includes the installation of new asphalt paving, Belgian block curbing, and decorative pedestrian lighting. Existing site features such as benches, a water fountain, and a book exchange cabinet will be evaluated for reuse or relocation, and existing sports lighting will be reviewed for potential upgrades. The overall goal is to modernize the facility while enhancing accessibility, aesthetics, and stormwater management.

WHEREAS, the brave men and women of the Woodcliff Lake Fire Department dedicate their lives in protecting and serving our community with unwavering courage and commitment; and




WHEREAS, Clay was elected Chairman in 2000 and continues to hold that position today.

honoring his contributions to our Borough and twenty-nine years of service on the Shade Tree Committee and twenty-five of those years as Chairman of the Shade Tree Committee.

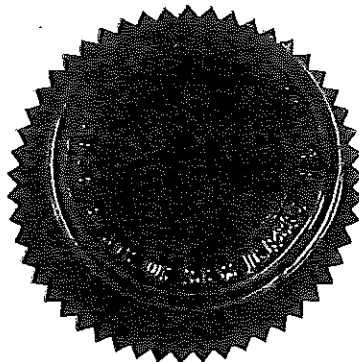

WHEREAS, trees in our borough increase property values and enhance the economic vitality of business areas; and


WHEREAS, the Borough of Woodcliff Lake is celebrating its nineteenth year as a Tree City USA community.

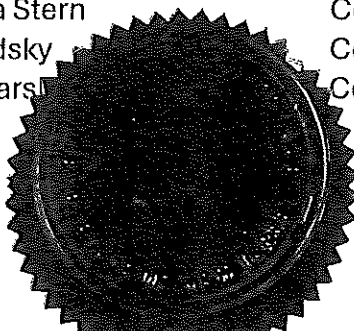

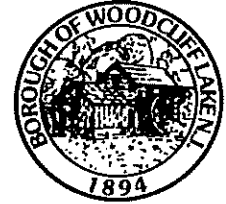

APRIL ENGINEERS REPORT
BOROUGH OF WOODCLIFF LAKE
APRIL 11, 2025**1. Galaxy Gardens Civil Design and NJDEP Land Use Permitting**

Project awarded to Applied Landscape for the total contract amount of \$2,753,123.00. Change Order No. 1 for Monument Area add-on and associated sitework in the amount of \$97,855.47 (3.55%) was approved by the Borough per Resolution No. 24-259. The sitework, grading, drainage, walkways, lighting, and landscaping improvements are substantially complete. The restroom building structure is substantially complete. Bandshell, pavilion, and sign structures are substantially complete. Contractor is working toward final project completion for a Borough ribbon cutting/opening on 5/3/25 to be coordinated with the Borough.

2. Werimus Lane Pump Station Flood Resilient Improvements

Bids were opened on December 5, 2024 and reviewed by our office. Award recommendation package provided to Borough on 12/6/2024 recommending award of a contract to J.Fletcher Creamer and Sons for the amount of \$1,892,500.00 which was the lowest of four (4) bids submitted. Preconstruction meeting was held January 21 2025. Contractor proceeding with test pits, pre-project planning and submittals to secure long lead time items with anticipated sitework to begin in June following school closure.

3. Campbell Avenue Paving Project NJDOT MA-2023 & Year 2023 Municipal Paving Project

The Borough of Woodcliff Lake received a grant in the amount of \$203,110.00 from the NJDOT for Campbell Avenue Paving Project as per the November 23, 2022 grant award letter. Project awarded to D&L Paving in the amount of \$551,105.11 for the Base Bid and Alternates A, B, C, and D for Campbell Avenue (NJDOT), Birchwood Road, Stacey Court, Renee Court, and Manhole Reconstructions. Pre-construction meeting was held on 6/6/2024. Birchwood Road drainage has been completed. Paving of Campbell Avenue, Stacey Court, Renee Court was completed. Birchwood Road has been temporarily restored with asphalt with final paving to occur in Spring 2025 following the settlement period of the drainage pipe trenching. Neglia to follow up with Contractor for scheduling of Birchwood Road final paving.

4. Werimus Road/Old Mill/Woodcliff Avenue Traffic Signal Warrant Analysis

Neglia completed and provided the Traffic Signal Warrant Analysis to the Borough and County of Bergen for review. Neglia attended and conference call with the Borough and County (Nancy Dargis) to discuss the report on 2/19/2025. Nancy indicated that although the intersection meets the pedestrian connectivity criteria to connect the recreation complex and fields to the new park, the traffic counts are on the lower end. Neglia provided Concept Plan for interim pedestrian improvements to enhance pedestrian safety for review and consideration ahead of any future traffic signal improvements and met with the Borough on 3/31/25 to review the concept plan. Neglia to draft letter to Bergen County requesting reduction in speed on Werimus Road to be placed on Borough letterhead.

**5. MS4 Stormwater Mapping, MS4 Updated MSWP, Phase Watershed Improvement Plan
MS4 Stormwater Mapping**

Neglia provided a proposal for MS4 Stormwater Mapping to address the latest NJDEP MS4 Regulations to the Borough. Neglia is prepared to proceed with the MS4 Stormwater Mapping once our proposal is approved/authorized by the Borough. This mapping needs to be completed and submitted by **January 1, 2026** for Borough MS4 Compliance. We would respectfully request that this proposal authorized asap in order to have sufficient time to complete the work for the January 1, 2026 NJDEP deadline as we estimate it will take approximately 8-12 months to complete the work.

MS4 Updated Municipal Stormwater Management Plan (MSWMP)

Neglia provided a proposal to prepare a revised Municipal Stormwater Management Plan (MSWMP) as required by the NJDEP. The Borough's MSWP is from 2005 and the NJDEP requires the plan be updated at a minimum once every 10 years based on the most current Stormwater Control Ordinance (SCO).

Watershed Inventory Report – Phase I Watershed Improvement Plan

The Borough of Woodcliff Lake, along with all other municipalities in the State of New Jersey must prepare a Watershed Improvement Plan as part of the NJDEP Municipal Stormwater Management Program (MS4). Phase 1 of this Plan is to prepare the Watershed Inventory Report. This Report must be submitted to the NJDEP no later than **January 01, 2026**. Therefore, we would respectfully request that this proposal be authorized no later than mid-2025 to ensure that sufficient time is provided to prepare this NJDEP-required document.

6. Broadway Corridor Streetscape Improvement Project (NJDOT MA-2024)

The Borough of Woodcliff Lake received a grant in the amount of \$233,364.00 from the NJDOT for the Broadway Corridor Streetscape Improvements Project (Prospect to Campbell) as per the November 1, 2023 NJDOT grant award letter. Neglia has provided a proposal for the Engineering Design and Construction Management for review & execution by the Borough in order to stay on track with the NJDOT MA 2024 award deadline of **October 31, 2025**. Neglia is prepared to proceed with the survey, design, and NJDOT PMRS pre-bid submissions once our proposal is approved/authorized by the Borough.

Neglia prepared a set of draft Broadway Streetscape Standard Details to comply with the Borough's Ordinance 24-15 containing the design standards for properties fronting Broadway for the sidewalks, paver belt, shade trees, and decorative street lighting. These details, once finalized and approved will be utilized by developers along the Broadway corridor and also for the Borough's Broadway Corridor Streetscape Improvements Project for consistency.

7. NJDOT FY2025 Grant – West Hill Road

Borough received a FY25 NJDOT MA Grant in the amount of \$133,035.00 for the repaving of West Hill Road in accordance with the Grant Application submitted. Neglia proceeding with survey and design of bid documents with anticipated pre-bid submission to the NJDOT by the first week of May with bidding to follow NJDOT and Borough approval of the same.

8. Brookview Drive Roadway Improvements (Municipal Paving)

Neglia provided a proposal to prepare bid documents and construction management services for the Brookview Drive paving project. Neglia proceeding with survey and design of bid documents with the intention of bidding this paving project together with the West Hill Road NJDOT paving project following NJDOT and Borough approval of the same.

9. Old Barn Site and Train Station Parking Lot (North Side)

Neglia completed pre-bid review agency submissions to NJ Transit, Bergen County, Bergen County Soil Conservation District, Veolia, and the NJDEP. The final day for NJDEP Land Use Application is on or about April 18, 2025. Neglia met with NJ Transit as per conference call on 2/7/2025 and completed a preliminary Temporary Access Permit (TAP) application to be incorporated into the bid documents for final execution by the Contractor and Borough. 

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 250 ENTITLED "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC" OF THE BOROUGH CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF WOODCLIFF LAKE, STATE OF NEW JERSEY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF WOODCLIFF LAKE IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, Chapter 250, of the Code of the Borough of Woodcliff Lake sets forth all regulations regarding Vehicles and Traffic within the Borough of Woodcliff Lake; and,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Woodcliff Lake, County of Bergen and State of New Jersey that those portions of the aforesaid set forth below are hereby amended as follows and that those portions of the Ordinance not set forth below shall remain unchanged.

Chapter 250-3. Prohibited Parking; Time Limit Parking, Handicap Parking.

E. Restricted Parking on Borough-Owned Properties.

(6) Parking Permits. A parking permit shall be required to park in the Commuter Train Station parking lot, Apostolic Church parking lot and the Borough Hall parking lot Monday through Friday at a cost of \$50.00 per permit, per year. Residents shall be issued a parking permit on a first come first serve basis. A total of 300 permits will be issued per year. Permits are issued to residents only and proof of residency is required. Parking permits are required and will be enforced Monday through Friday. All permits shall be applied for and processed through the Woodcliff Lake Police Department.

(a) The penalty for parking without a permit shall be as follows: (a) first offense-\$50.00; (b) second offense-\$100.00 ; and (c) third offense and continuing-\$250.00.

Severability All provisions of this Ordinance are severable. If for any reason, any provision of this Ordinance is held to be invalid, the validity of the remainder of the Ordinance shall not be affected.

Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon final approval and publication, pursuant to law, and upon completion of all outstanding cases.

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Woodcliff lake in the County of Bergen finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2025 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council hereby determines that a 1.0% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$124,712 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and

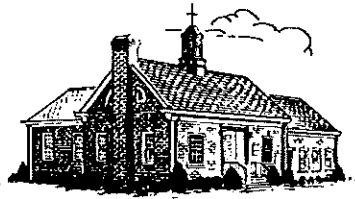
WHEREAS the Mayor and Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Woodcliff Lake, in the County of Bergen, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2025 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Woodcliff Lake shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$436,492 and that the CY 2025 municipal budget for the Borough of Woodcliff Lake be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

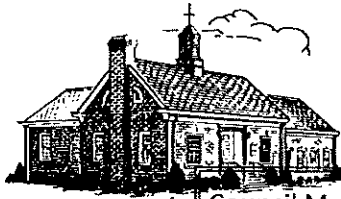

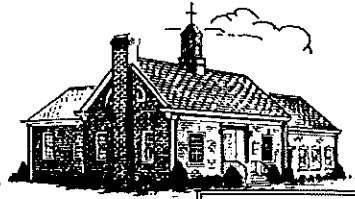

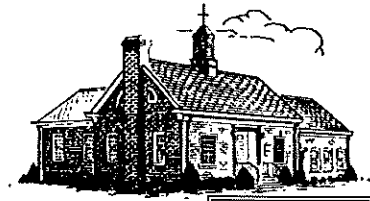

WHEREAS, there are two inconsistent statements addressing the interest to be paid under the settlement set forth in the February 27, 2025 settlement recommendation letter; and

WHEREAS, the amended settlement recommendation will result in confirmation that interest shall be applied to the refund payments at a rate of five percent (5%) per annum, with interest beginning to accrue from the date of entry of the Tax Court Judgment and continuing to accrue with respect to each refund payment through the date each payment is paid.

2. The Resolution adopted on March 17, 2025 is hereby amended to reflect that interest shall be paid on the refund payments.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Woodcliff Lake ("Borough") is authorized pursuant to the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 et seq. (the "LRHL") to determine whether certain parcels of land within the Borough constitute an "area in need of redevelopment"; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution 24-210 the Borough Council directed the Borough's Land Use Board to undertake a preliminary investigation of Block 301, Lot 3 ("Property") to determine whether the Property constitutes an area of non-condemnation redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, J. Rocker Development, LLC, the contract purchaser of the Property, and the Borough of Woodcliff Lake desire to enter into an Escrow Agreement to fund the costs and expenses in connection with exploring the redevelopment of the Property; and

WHEREAS, the Borough by entering into the Escrow Funding Agreement does not provide any assurance of a particular result, the intent being only to defray the costs and expenses of exploring the potential for redevelopment of the Property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough of Woodcliff Lake as follows:

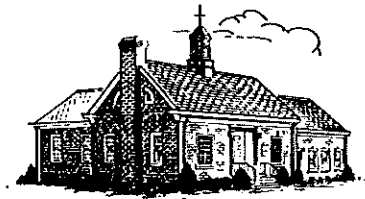

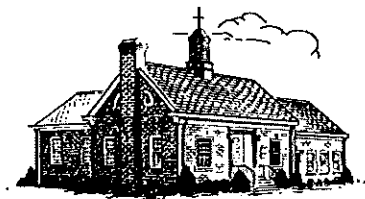

FIRE DEPARTMENT MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT BOROUGH OF WOODCLIFF LAKE

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Woodcliff Lake, County of Bergen, New Jersey that it hereby authorizes the Borough of Woodcliff Lake Fire Department to provide mutual aid services to any community or district that the Fire Chief or his designated representative deems necessary.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Borough of Woodcliff Lake will provide its insurance carrier and its insurance agents with copies of this resolution to insure that insurance coverage, in the same manner as provided on an everyday basis, is provided to the Borough of Woodcliff Lake and its representatives during the time period mutual aid is provided to another community or district.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Governing Body of Pearl River, New York and to the Borough of Woodcliff Lake's Volunteer Fire Department.
