PUBLIC COMMENT

(Limited to 3 minutes per speaker)

MOTION to open to the public was made by Councilwoman Brodsky, second by Council President Sterns, and unanimously approved.

Bert Taylor, Woodcliff Lake, stated that he is aware of Ordinance No. 25-12 which is on for introduction tonight for a PILOT Agreement for 300 Chestnut Ridge Road. Mr. Taylor asked if they will be able to ask questions at the next meeting regarding this. Council President Stern replied yes. Mr. Taylor stated that he is aware of the construction taking place at 188 Broadway, BMW project and the possibility of development at the old Hilton site. Woodcliff Lake has a lot happening. Mr. Taylor stated that he hopes it all turns out as we hope it will. Mr. Taylor stated that he went to the open house at 188 Broadway over the weekend. The paperwork that they gave out for the townhomes states that they will be listed for \$1.39 million. They also used the word abatement, and he wanted to know if the Borough was aware of that. Council President Stern stated that this was part of a lawsuit that was settled in the past with the developer. The abatement was for the townhouses only. We are not looking at this for any other development in Woodcliff Lake.

Josephine Higgins, Woodcliff Lake, stated that she has known Clay Bosch a long time and thanked him for his service to our Country. Ms. Higgins stated that she is nervous about the abatement at 188 Broadway. She believes that the Mayor and Council should also concentrate on keeping the people that have lived in the town for a long time here in Woodcliff Lake, not just new residents. Council President Stern stated that the seniors are always on their minds. When he and Councilman Pollack work on the budget and finances, they always think of the seniors when deciding budgets.

MOTION to close to the public was made by Councilman Pollack, second by Councilman Bonanno and unanimously approved.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Rendo congratulated Councilman Pollack and Councilwoman Marsh on their re-election. This is one of the better Councils that he has served on. Mayor Rendo stated that Corrado Belgiovine is most likely happy to be back on the Land Use Board. We all work well together for the benefit of our community. It is always important to give back to your community. Mayor Rendo stated that he recently received a letter from a resident. When we deal with the development coming into our surrounding areas, we need to be cognizant of the impact that it has on our community. Mayor Rendo stated that he wishes the NJDEP would be more conscientious about overdevelopment in Montvale and Park Ridge, especially the development that affects the Clairmont section of Woodcliff Lake. The property owners of the Sony property filed a request for a waiver with the NJDEP to build on the wetlands in that area. They clear cut that area and the properties in Woodcliff Lake are becoming flooded. Mayor Rendo asked Borough Attorney John Schettino, with the Council's consent, to send a letter to the DEP regarding the cutting of trees in the Clairmont area. Woodcliff Lake residents are being flooded by development in Montvale and Park Ridge. Park Ridge fought it and spent over \$1 million fighting it and lost. Both towns clear-cut large areas. Administrator Padilla stated that we are waiting to get some information from our engineer before John sends the letter to the DEP.

COUNCIL REPORTS

Councilman Pollack congratulated Nicole Marsh on winning re-election and thanked Corrado Belgiovine and Nick Pulsonetti for putting their hats in the ring. Police negotiations are still taking place, and they hope to have a Resolution for the next meeting. We have reached a tentative agreement on the PBA contract. A special thank you to our police department during the Halloween festivities on the hill. A tree came down adjacent to many children, and they cleared the scene very quickly. The train station might be open by tomorrow. They are doing final paving on the tracks. Lastly, we have Resolution No. 25-262 regarding the award and contract of sale for 55 Woodcliff Avenue which is currently on the Agenda for Non-Consent. After brief discussions before this meeting, he personally feels satisfied with what that property is currently zoned for as residential use as well as evaluating the Borough's need for that property or lack thereof going forward. He would support the sale and if any requests come in the future to the Land use Board to change that use that they leave it as residential or similar use.

MOTION was made to move Resolution No. 25-262 to the Consent Agenda was made by Councilwoman Margolis, second by Councilman Pollack and approved by Councilman Bonanno, Councilwoman Brodsky, Councilwoman Margolis, Councilwoman Marsh, Councilman Pollack and Council President Stern.

Councilman Bonanno congratulated Ben Pollack and Nicole Marsh on their win for re-election. Mr. Bonanno stated that he has been on the Council now for 10-11 months and it is great to see

how hard everyone works in this town and for this town. DPW has been busy with leaf pick-up and street paving. Councilman Bonanno stated that the seniors will be having their holiday party on December 4, 2025.

Councilwoman Brodsky stated that the initial banners for the Veterans are up at the park. We had a total of 18. Some new applications came in this week. Thank you to Dave Linko and his staff for getting the banners up while still picking up leaves. The Bergen County Winter Wonderland Christmas Tree Decorating Contest theme is Home for the Holidays – celebrating Woodcliff Lake. Our students will help decorate the tree with hand-crafted decorations. Last year Woodcliff Lake came in second place so there will be a free ice-skating session on December 18, 2025, from 6PM to 9PM at Van Saun Park. All residents are welcome. The Pascack Hills Players will be performing Radiant Girls on November 14 and 15 at 7PM and Sunday at 2PM at Pascack Hills. The tree lighting date is still being looked at. The Menorah Lighting is December 14th at Woodcliff Park.

Councilwoman Margolis stated we still have t-shirts from the Chili Cook-off available for sale. Please contact the fire department, herself or Councilwoman Marsh if you are interested in purchasing. Our DPW averted a very big issue on Brookview Drive. They were able to clear a line before it backed up and before the street was paved. If you see something that does not look right, please let our Borough Hall or DPW know. All food pantries around the County are empty. We are partnering with Park Ridge and Montvale for food collections. There is a bin located at our police department for anyone wanting to donate. Thank you to all our residents who have been donating. There will also be a turkey drive. She received word from the Baseball Association that their teams had a lot of wins this season. Councilwoman Margolis and Councilman Bonanno will be meeting this week to discuss the Chamber of Commerce and come up with a plan of action. We will be updating our list for our Film Ready. The Seniors will be having their Holiday Party on December 4, 2025, at Bacari Grill. Tickets are still available.

Councilwoman Marsh congratulated Ben Pollack on his re-election. Everyone ran a nice campaign, and she looks forward to working with the Council going forward. The Land Use Board's next meeting is this Thursday at 7:00 PM at Borough Hall. There are 2 small applications and then a discussion regarding 300 Chestnut Ridge Road. On December 2, 2025, at 7:00 PM there will be a special meeting for the application of 300 Chestnut Ridge Road. Our next Mayor and Council Meeting will take place on December 10th at 7:30 PM at the Tice Senior Center to discuss the PILOT Program at 300 Chestnut Ridge Road. We want our professionals to be there to give a presentation and answer any questions. The entire Council takes their commitment to this town very seriously and they encourage all residents to attend meetings and to reach out with questions. Any development that we are bringing into Woodcliff Lake is held to a high standard and looking to make an asset to our community. That will especially be shown in the projects that are coming in.

Council President Stern stated that he was going to mention the baseball teams and their wonderful performance. He congratulates all of them on a great season. Council President Stern stated that he has met with Bert Taylor for multiple hours to go over questions that he has had

and he encourages all residents to reach out to him or any other Council member if they have any questions. We will always be available to meet or speak on the phone.

Councilwoman Margolis stated that we have a Resolution on the Agenda regarding the outsourcing of sanitation. Garbage will stay to once a week pick up. We are the only town in the Pascack Valley that still picks up garbage. This will give our DPW more time to do more projects and concentrate on other areas. We will be outsourcing garbage come February.

Council President Stern stated that Resolution No. 25-265 is on the Non-Consent Agenda based on timing. MOTION to move Resolution No. 25-265 to the Consent Agenda was made by Councilwoman Margolis, second by Councilman Bonanno and approved by Councilman Bonanno, Councilwoman Brodsky, Councilwoman Margolis, Councilwoman Marsh, Councilman Pollack and Council President Stern.

Administrator Padilla stated that for clarification, Resolution No. 25-265 is in reference to a plan that we will be adding to our health benefits program and has a part in the PBA Agreement. This plan will help us save money on our premiums in the years to come. Council President Stern stated that one of our large costs in the budget last year was insurance costs. Administrator Padilla also stated that Resolution No. 25-259 is to renew our lease agreement with the Apostolic Church that is used for parking for the bus or train station. Administrator Padilla stated that Tri-Boro Ambulance will be having an open house this Sunday from 12PM to 4PM.

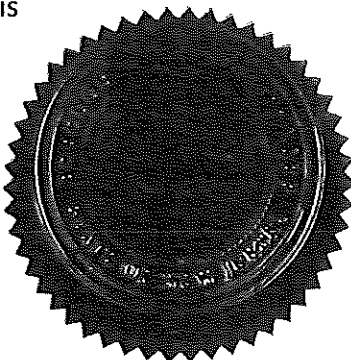

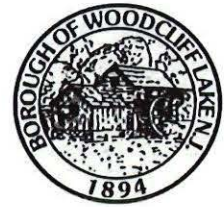

**NOVEMBER ENGINEERS REPORT
BOROUGH OF WOODCLIFF LAKE
NOVEMBER 3, 2025**



1. Galaxy Gardens Civil Design and NJDEP Land Use Permitting

Project awarded to Applied Landscape for the total contract amount of \$2,753,123.00. Change Order No. 1 for Monument Area add-on and associated sitework in the amount of \$97,855.47 (3.55%) was approved by the Borough per Resolution No. 24-259. Project is substantially complete. Final remaining punch list items to be completed with final payment package to be provided asap.

2. Werimus Lane Pump Station Flood Resilient Improvements

Bids were opened on December 5, 2024 and reviewed by our office. Award recommendation package provided to Borough on 12/6/2024 recommending award of a contract to J.Fletcher Creamer and Sons for the amount of \$1,892,500.00 which was the lowest of four (4) bids submitted. Preconstruction meeting was held January 21, 2025. JFC has notified our office of delays in securing the emergency generator and pump station equipment that impacted the overall project schedule. Contractor is now mobilized and anticipated start of foundations & backup pumping to begin next week pending PSEG disconnect of existing service powering the old pump station to be taken out of service. Contractor working towards project completion and anticipated startup in spring 2026.

3. Campbell Avenue Paving Project NJDOT MA-2023 & Year 2023 Municipal Paving Project

The Borough of Woodcliff Lake received a grant in the amount of \$203,110.00 from the NJDOT for Campbell Avenue Paving Project as per the November 23, 2022 grant award letter. Project awarded to D&L Paving in the amount of \$551,105.11 for the Base Bid and Alternates A, B, C, and D for Campbell Avenue (NJDOT), Birchwood Road, Stacey Court, Renee Court, and Manhole Reconstructions. Pre-construction meeting was held on 6/6/2024. Birchwood Road drainage has been completed. Paving of Campbell Avenue, Stacey Court, Renee Court, and Birchwood was completed. Final punch list has been completed, bond provided, and final payment and project closeout approved at 8/18/2025 meeting. NJDOT closeout package submitted by Neglia and is under review by NJDOT for final payment.

4. **Werimus Road/Woodcliff Avenue Pedestrian Improvements**

Neglia prepared plans and details for proposed pedestrian improvements to enhance pedestrian safety at the Werimus Road/Woodcliff Avenue/Old Mill intersection consisting of striping, signage, ADA ramps, missing sidewalk connection for review and comment by Bergen County and Borough in accordance with our proposal and Resolution No. 25-244 dated August 18. Ordinance for new crosswalk on Woodcliff Avenue to the parking provided to Borough/Borough Attorney for review and adoption as required by Bergen County for the crossing.

5. **MS4 Stormwater Mapping, MS4 Updated MSWP, Phase Watershed Improvement Plan**

MS4 Stormwater Mapping

Neglia provided a proposal for MS4 Stormwater Mapping to address the latest NJDEP MS4 Regulations to the Borough. Neglia is prepared to proceed with the MS4 Stormwater Mapping once our proposal is approved/authorized by the Borough. This mapping needs to be completed and submitted by **January 1, 2026** for Borough MS4 Compliance. Neglia proceeding with this work in accordance with the authorized proposal and supporting resolution.

MS4 Updated Municipal Stormwater Management Plan (MSWMP)

Neglia provided a proposal to prepare a revised Municipal Stormwater Management Plan (MSWMP) as required by the NJDEP. The Borough's MSWP is from 2005 and the NJDEP requires the plan be updated at a minimum once every 10 years based on the most current Stormwater Control Ordinance (SCO).

Watershed Inventory Report – Phase I Watershed Improvement Plan

The Borough of Woodcliff Lake, along with all other municipalities in the State of New Jersey must prepare a Watershed Improvement Plan as part of the NJDEP Municipal Stormwater Management Program (MS4). Phase 1 of this Plan is to prepare the Watershed Inventory Report. This Report must be submitted to the NJDEP no later than **January 01, 2026**. Neglia is proceeding with the preparation of this report in accordance with our proposal and Resolution No. 25-247.

6. **Broadway Corridor Streetscape Improvement Project (NJDOT MA-2024)**

The Borough of Woodcliff Lake received a grant in the amount of \$233,364.00 from the NJDOT for the Broadway Corridor Streetscape Improvements Project (Prospect to Campbell) as per the November 1, 2023 NJDOT grant award letter. Neglia is proceeding with the design and bid documents for NJDOT pre-bid submission. Neglia submitted to PSEG for street lighting coordination and to NJDOT for pre-bid review. Neglia submitted a 6-month extension from NJDOT to allow for sufficient time for NJDOT approval and PSEG Street lighting coordination prior to bidding. Plans and specifications are ready for bidding pending PSEG approval and confirmation of fees for PSEG street lighting.

7. NJDOT FY2025 Grant – West Hill Road

Neglia completed plans and specifications and submitted to the NJDOT for mandatory pre-bid review on 5/11/2025. Plans approved by NJDOT and bids were opened on July 24, 2025. Pre-Construction meeting was held on 8/20/2025. Paving of West Hill Road was recently completed. Punch list, NJDOT final inspection, final payment and project closeout is remaining.

8. Brookview Drive Roadway Improvements (Municipal Paving)

Neglia completed plans and specifications for bidding this paving project together with the West Hill Road NJDOT paving project following NJDOT and Borough approval of the same. Neglia met with DPW to add include the replacement of a compromised storm drain in Brookview Drive near the intersection of Colonial Avenue into the bid specifications. Plans approved by NJDOT and bids were opened on July 24, 2025. Pre-Construction meeting was held on 8/20/2025. Paving of Stephen Court and Lyons Court was completed. Paving of Brookview Drive from Colonial to Werimus to be completed following ongoing storm drainage pipe repair.

9. Old Barn Site and Train Station Parking Lot (North Side)

NJDEP Land Use Approval was received on 4/16/2025. All pre-bid submissions and approvals have been received. Bids were opened on June 26, 2025 and recommendation package recommending award of contractor to AJM Contracting in the amount of \$635,995.00 pending available funds, attorney review and Borough approval of the same. Pre-Construction meeting with Borough, NJ Transit, and Contractor was held on 8/7/2025. Milling and paving of the south parking lot across street was completed and payment package no. 1 provided to the Borough for processing. Ongoing retaining wall work at the lower lot with the contractor working towards project completion and parking areas re-opened by the end of the year.

10. Woodcliff Lake Tennis Courts

Neglia understands that the Borough of Woodcliff Lake intends to pursue upgrades to the existing tennis court complex locate within Block 1401 Lot 5 in the Borough of Woodcliff Lake. Survey was completed and a Preliminary Concept Plan for redevelopment of the site with new courts, and Preliminary estimate was provided to the Borough. A proposal for full engineering design, bidding and NJDEP permitting was provided to the Borough and resent following our meeting with the Borough to review the preliminary pricing obtained by the Borough from Vendors. Neglia is prepared to proceed with the design and the NJDEP pre-bid submissions once our proposal is approved/authorized by the Borough.

11. Digital Tax Maps

Neglia provided a proposal to the Borough for Surveying and GIS services to provide updated Digital Tax maps to meet all current NJ Regulations and Standards as requested.

12. Woodcliff Avenue & Woodcliff Middle School Drainage Improvements

As requested, Neglia provided a proposal to the Borough for survey, design, and NJDEP Land Use permitting to perform a drainage study for the purposes of designing proposed drainage improvements to address storm drainage conveyance issues and concerns both upstream and downstream of Woodcliff Avenue that are adversely impacting the Woodcliff Middle School property for review by the Borough and for coordination with the Borough, School, and County of Bergen.

13. Major Field Improvements

We understand the Borough is considering improvements to Major Field including but not limited to infield turf conversion, new backstop with possible relocation, new fencing, drainage improvements, new dugouts and associated site improvements and site restoration. Neglia has provided a proposal for Survey and Preliminary Engineering Services for the Major Field Improvements Project to confirm the scope of work, dimensions for possible backstop relocation and a preliminary engineer's estimate for review and evaluation by the Borough.

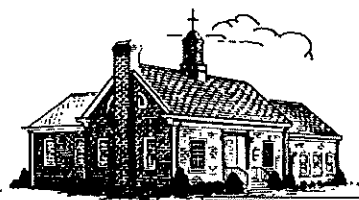

**RESOLUTION NO. 25-255
NOVEMBER 10, 2025**

WHEREAS, the Borough of Woodcliff Lake is subject to certain requirements of the Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-6, et seq., and

WHEREAS, the Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12, provides that an Executive Session, not open to the public, may be held for certain specified purposes when authorized by Resolution; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Borough of Woodcliff Lake to discuss in a session not open to the public certain matters relating to the item or items authorized by N.J.S.A. 10:4-12b and designated below:

_____1. Matters Required by Law to be Confidential. Any matter which, by express provision of Federal law or State statute or rule of court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act.

_____2. Matters Where the Release of Information Would Impair the Right to Receive Funds. Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the Government of the United States.

_____3. Matters Involving Individual Privacy. **RESOLUTION NO. 25-263

WHEREAS, the Borough of Woodcliff Lakes ("Borough") is a political subdivision of the State of New Jersey, located in Bergen County; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 et seq., as amended and supplemented (the "LRHL"), provides a process for municipalities to participate in the redevelopment and improvement of areas in need of redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, Borough Council of the Borough of Woodcliff (the "Governing Body") directed the Woodcliff Lake Land Use Board (hereinafter referred to as the "Board"), pursuant to Resolution #34-311 (adopted on December 16, 2024), to conduct a preliminary investigation to determine whether any deleterious conditions prevail upon certain property identified as Block 602, Lot 1, as depicted on the official Tax Map of the Borough of Woodcliff Lake (hereinafter referred to as the "Study Area" or "Property") thereby constituting "an area in need of redevelopment" in accordance with LHRL; and

WHEREAS, at a public hearing, the Board reviewed the Study Area, along with a report prepared by the Borough's professional planner, and further heard testimony on the proposed Study Area, and after a duly noticed public hearing on April 22, 2025, the Board found that the Study Area met the statutory criteria for "an area in need of redevelopment" under the LHRL; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 25-186, adopted on June 16, 2025, the Governing Body approved the Board's recommendation and designated the Study Area as a "Non-Condensation Area In Need of Redevelopment" according to the criteria set forth in the LHRL; and

WHEREAS the Governing Body directed the Borough's professional planning consultant to prepare that certain redevelopment plan entitled "300 Chestnut Ridge Road Redevelopment Plan, Borough of Woodcliff Lake, Bergen County, New Jersey", prepared by FAR Planning, 190 Veteran's Drive, Northvale, New Jersey 07647 (hereinafter referred to as the "Redevelopment Plan"); and

WHEREAS, on September 15, 2025, the Governing Body adopted Ordinance No. 25-11 and the Redevelopment Plan after conducting the requisite hearings therefore and referral of same to the Planning Board for consistency review pursuant to the LHRL; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body is authorized to exercise certain powers under the LHRL, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-8, including but not limited to ability to negotiate with developers to undertake redevelopment projects; and

WHEREAS, the Property is owned by third party, BMW OF NORTH AMERICA LLC ("Property Owner") formed and operated under the laws of the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, RW Woodcliff Lake Urban Renewal, LLC is the contract purchaser of the Property and proposes to develop, finance, construct, implement, and cohesively redevelop the Study Area into two hundred and ninety-seven (297) rental apartment units including 34 affordable units; a minimum of nine thousand (9,000 sq. ft.) square feet of retail and/or restaurant food/drink establishment or other permitted use; a 40 bed, supportive housing building; forty-seven (47) townhomes made available to the public as "for sale units" together with such outdoor areas, landscaping, venues, parking facilities (including land banked parking) and such common area amenities as are typically part of a project of this caliber (hereinafter the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-8 (e) and (f) authorize the Governing Body, as the redevelopment entity, to enter into contracts or agreements for the planning, construction and undertaking of development projects and redevelopment work; and

WHEREAS, RW Woodcliff Lake Urban Renewal, LLC seeks to be designated as the "redeveloper" (as defined in the LHRL) of the Property so as to redevelop the Property with the Project in accordance with the Redevelopment Plan and the LHRL; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body has determined that RW Woodcliff Lake Urban Renewal, LLC possesses the proper qualifications and experience to implement and complete the Project in accordance with the Redevelopment Plan and should be appointed as Redeveloper for the Project Area to effectuate the Redevelopment Plan, the Project, and the redevelopment of the Project Area; and

WHEREAS, it is now the intention of the Borough and RW Woodcliff Lake Urban Renewal, LLC to enter into a redevelopment agreement (the "Redevelopment Agreement") setting forth the terms and conditions under which it agrees to develop the Project and finds that the Redevelopment Agreement furthers the Borough's interest in implementing the Redevelopment Plan and is consistent with the public purposes the Redevelopment Plan addresses; and

WHEREAS, the Borough desires to (i) designate RW Woodcliff Lake Urban Renewal, LLC as the “Redeveloper” of the Project in accordance with the LHRL, subject to the conditions set forth in the Redevelopment Agreement, which shall set forth the rights and obligations of the respective parties, as well as the anticipated time frame for the completion of certain tasks.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Woodcliff Lakes, County of Bergen and State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein.

Section 2. The Governing Body hereby designates RW Woodcliff Lake Urban Renewal, LLC as Redeveloper for the Property.

Section 3. The Governing Body hereby approves the Redevelopment Agreement, in substantially the form on file with the Borough Clerk.

Section 4. The Mayor and Borough Clerk are hereby authorized to sign the Redevelopment Agreement. Subject to such additions, deletions, modifications and/or amendments as may be deemed necessary by the Borough Attorney and or Redevelopment Attorney.

Section 5. The Mayor, Borough Administrator, Borough Clerk, Borough Attorney, Redevelopment Counsel and other appropriate Borough officials are hereby authorized and directed to take any and all other necessary action and to execute any document, instrument, certificate or agreement reasonably necessary to effectuate the transactions contemplated by the Redevelopment Agreement and to effectuate the purposes of this Resolution.

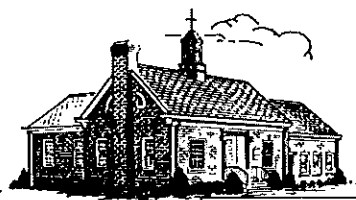

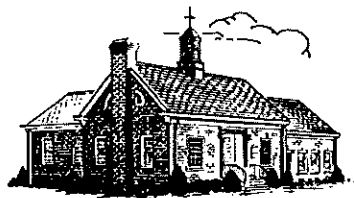
