Don't Let Mosquitoes Move In!

Protect Your Home and Family from Mosquitoes

Did you know that any container holding water for just 7 days can become a breeding ground for mosquitoes?

With summer in full swing, Bergen County Mosquito Control urges all residents to help reduce mosquito populations by checking their yards for standing water. From buckets, toys, and flowerpots to gutters and tarps—mosquitoes can breed in the smallest of puddles.

Use the County's Home Mosquito Habitat Checklist to identify and eliminate these hidden dangers around your property. Key tips include:

- Empty buckets, saucers, and watering cans regularly
- Drill drainage holes in garbage bins and sandboxes
- Clean gutters and fix leaky spigots
- Flip over or store toys, wheelbarrows, and kiddie pools when not in use
- Treat standing water that can't be drained with a safe Bti product

Even children's toys and recreational equipment can harbor mosquito larvae—be sure to inspect and maintain them often!

RECYCLING DAYS ARE: ZONES A&C will be collected on Wednesdays and ZONES B&D collected on Thursdays.
- All Garbage and Recycling containers must be 40 gallons or less in size and not for automated trucks.
- Recycling is collected by Sterling Carting - DPW will continue pickup of regular garbage & cleanup.
- Cleanup = bulky garbage/metals/bundled brush. All neatly separated at the curb.
- All recycling, garbage and cleanup materials must be out by 6 am on collection days and containers removed from curb by 8 pm that night.
- Recycling and cleanup items must be at the curb. NOT IN PLASTIC BAGS. Brush tied up in bundles or in cans to be emptied.

- Burglaries: Keep lights on when away or use timers to make your home appear occupied.

- Ride only in low-traffic areas
- Stop and look before entering a road

- Ride on the right-hand side of the street
- Follow all traffic signs and signals
- Walk your bike across busy intersections, crosswalks, and railroad tracks

Swimming Safety Tips

Whether at a pool, lake, or the beach, please keep these water safety tips in mind:

- Always read and follow posted safety signs
- Walk—don't run—on pool decks
- Never push, shove, or roughhouse near water
- Enter and exit the water carefully
- Look before diving or jumping in
- Know your limits and stay within them
- Never swim alone
- Keep play safe and respectful



Stay Safe This Summer with Smart Water Practices!

As the warm weather arrives and residents head to local pools, lakes, and waterparks, the Borough of Woodcliff Lake reminds everyone to stay vigilant and prepared when

enjoying water activities. Follow these essential water safety tips to ensure a safe and fun experience for all:

Supervise Children at All Times

Always watch children closely when they're in or near water — even if lifeguards are on duty. Accidents can happen quickly and silently.

Wear a Lifejacket

Whether you're boating, paddleboarding, or swimming in open water, wearing a properly fitted lifejacket can save lives — especially for children and inexperienced swimmers.

Learn CPR

Immediate response in emergencies makes a difference. CPR knowledge can be the critical link that saves a life in the event of a near-drowning incident.

Stay Away from Drains

Pool and spa drains can be hazardous. Teach children to stay clear of suction outlets to avoid entrapment risks.

Ensure You Can See the Bottom

Clear water is safe water. If visibility is low, avoid swimming until the water is clean and you can see the bottom clearly.

Learn How to Swim

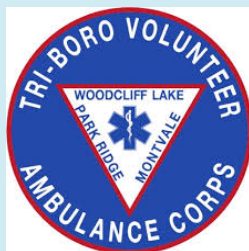

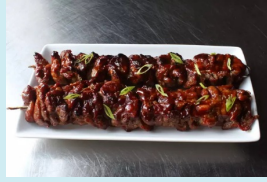

□ August Recipe of the Month: Grilled BBQ Pork Skewers



Fire up the grill and enjoy the last stretch of summer with this flavorful, easy-to-make dish that's perfect for backyard dinners or weekend gatherings. These BBQ Pork Skewers are packed with smoky spice, sweet barbecue flavor, and a tender bite that's sure to please a crowd!

Prep Time: 25 mins
Cook Time: 40 mins
Marinate Time: 4 hrs
Total Time: 5 hrs 5 mins
Servings: 8

□ Ingredients:

- 1 (2-pound) pork shoulder
- ¼ cup grated onion
- 1 large clove garlic, finely grated
- 1 tablespoon light brown sugar
- 2 teaspoons kosher salt
- 1 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1 teaspoon paprika
- ½ teaspoon ground cumin
- ¼ teaspoon cayenne pepper
- ½ cup prepared barbecue sauce
- Metal skewers (as needed)

□ Instructions:

1. Slice & Prep:
2. Slice pork shoulder in half lengthwise, then slice each half crosswise into 1/8-inch-thick slices.
3. Marinate:
4. Place pork in a large mixing bowl. Add grated onion, garlic, brown sugar, salt, pepper, paprika, cumin, and cayenne. Mix thoroughly with your hands.
5. Cover and refrigerate for 4 to 8 hours to allow flavors to infuse.
6. Grill:
7. Preheat a charcoal grill to medium-high heat and lightly oil the grate.
8. Thread pork slices onto metal skewers, folding longer pieces if needed. Pack the slices snugly together.
9. Cook:
10. Grill skewers, turning frequently, until the meat is browned and cooked through (about 30 minutes).
11. Finish with Sauce:
12. Brush with barbecue sauce and continue grilling for an additional 10 minutes, turning often, until caramelized and slightly crispy on the edges.
13. (Internal temperature should reach 160°F / 71°C.)

Serve hot with grilled veggies, coleslaw, or your favorite summer side dish!
Pro Tip: This recipe can also be made with chicken or tofu for a tasty variation!
