Weekly household garbage collection by DPW stays the same by Zone.

RECYCLING DAYS ARE: ZONES A&C will be collected on Wednesdays and ZONES B&D collected on Thursdays.

- All Garbage and Recycling containers must be 40 gallons or less in size and not for automated trucks.
- Recycling is collected by Sterling Carting - DPW will continue pickup of regular garbage & cleanup.
- Cleanup = bulky garbage/metals/bundled brush. All neatly separated at the curb.
- All recycling, garbage and cleanup materials must be out by 6 am on collection days and containers removed from curb by 8 pm that night.
- Recycling and cleanup items must be at the curb. NOT IN PLASTIC BAGS. Brush tied up in bundles or in cans to be emptied.

Fall Leaf Collection – 2025

The Borough's annual leaf collection program is just around the corner! Please review the important dates and guidelines below to ensure a smooth and efficient collection process:

- You may begin placing leaves at the curb starting: Monday, October 6th
- Leaf collection will begin on or around: Tuesday, October 14th
- Last day to place leaves at the curb: Sunday, December 7th

Important: Once the DPW has completed the final pass on your street, any remaining leaves must be removed and disposed of by the homeowner.

Reminders:

- Rake leaves to the curb — not into the street — to avoid blocking storm drains and maintain safe roadways.
- Do not include sticks, rocks, or debris in your leaf piles, as this can damage our equipment and cause delays.

We appreciate your cooperation in keeping Woodcliff Lake clean, safe, and beautiful this fall!

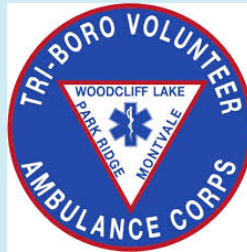

Peach Crisp: Everything You Love About Summer in One Bite

Celebrate the tail end of peach season with a dessert that's warm, comforting, and bursting with fresh flavor. This crisp is the perfect transition from summer into fall — best served with a scoop of vanilla ice cream!

Prep Time: 20 minutes
Cook Time: 1 hour 25 minutes
Cooling & Macerating Time: 1 hour 10 minutes
Total Time: 2 hours 55 minutes
Servings: 6 to 8

Ingredients

For the Filling:

- 4 1/2 pounds ripe peaches (about 15 medium peaches)
- 3/4 cup light brown sugar (4 3/4 ounces; 135 g)
- 3 tablespoons tapioca starch (about 1 ounce; 28 g)
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt (use half as much if using table salt)
- 2 teaspoons vanilla paste

For the Topping:

- 1 cup whole wheat flour (4 1/2 ounces; 130 g)
- 1/2 cup light brown sugar (3 1/4 ounces; 93 g)
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
- 10 tablespoons unsalted butter (cut into 1/2-inch cubes)
- 3/4 cup rolled oats (2 3/4 ounces; 75 g)
- 1/2 cup pecans, toasted and coarsely chopped (2 ounces; 57 g)
- Vanilla ice cream, for serving (optional)

Instructions

1. Preheat oven to 350°F (175°C). Set oven rack to the middle position.
2. Prepare peaches:
 - Bring a large pot of water to a boil. Set up an ice bath in a large bowl.
 - Score a small "X" at the base of each peach.
 - Boil peaches for 1–3 minutes until the skin starts to loosen.
 - Transfer to ice bath and cool for about 5 minutes.
 - Peel skins, remove pits, and slice peaches into 1/2-inch wedges.
1. Mix filling:
2. In a large bowl, whisk together brown sugar, tapioca starch, salt, and vanilla paste. Add peach slices and toss to coat. Let stand for 30 minutes.
3. Make topping:
4. In a food processor, pulse flour, sugar, and salt until combined. Add oats and pecans and pulse 2–3 times. Add butter and pulse until mixture resembles coarse crumbs.
5. Assemble and bake:
 - Pour peach filling and juices into a 9x9-inch baking dish and spread evenly.
 - Sprinkle topping evenly over the peaches.
 - Bake for about 1 hour and 15 minutes, until topping is golden and juices are bubbling.
 - Let cool for 30 minutes before serving.

Serve warm, optionally with a scoop of vanilla ice cream!

Enjoy this delicious September dessert with friends, family, or as a sweet finish to your Oktoberfest celebration!
