CALL TO ORDER

Notice of this meeting, in accordance with the "Open Public Meetings Law, 1975, C. "231", has been posted at the Borough Hall and two newspapers, <u>The Record</u> and <u>The Ridgewood News</u>, have been notified.

ROLL CALL

Mayor Rendo asked for a roll call. Council members Falanga, Hayes, Margolis and Margolis were present. Borough Attorney John Schettino was present, as well as Borough Administrator Tomas Padilla and Borough Clerk Debbie Dakin. Council President Gadaleta arrived at 6:35 PM and Councilwoman Higgins was absent.

CLOSED SESSION

Resolution No. 22-181

MOTION to approve Resolution No. 22-181 was made by Councilman Schnoll, second by Councilman Falanga and approved by Councilman Falanga, Council President Gadaleta, Councilwoman Hayes, Councilwoman Margolis, and Councilman Schnoll.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

All present recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion to approve the Minutes of July 11, 2022 (Open) was made by Council President Gadaleta, second by Councilwoman Margolis and approved by Councilman Falanga, Council President

Gadaleta, Councilwoman Hayes, and Councilwoman Margolis. Councilman Schnoll abstained, and Councilwoman Higgins was absent.

Motion to approve the Minutes of July 11, 2022 (Closed) was made by Council President Gadaleta, second by Councilwoman Margolis and approved by Councilman Falanga, Council President Gadaleta, Councilwoman Hayes, and Councilwoman Margolis. Councilman Schnoll abstained, and Councilwoman Higgins was absent.

PUBLIC COMMENT

MOTION to open to the public was made by Councilman Schnoll, second by Councilwoman Margolis and unanimously approved.

Ann Marie Borrelli, Woodcliff Lake, stated that the causeway is looking nice but is curious as to what else is planned for the beautification besides the walkway. Councilman Falanga stated that the walkway and flag poles were the first part of it. We will also be doing the fencing. We will be putting up a plaque at the train station to recognize all the residents who have donated trees over the years. Ms. Borrelli asked about the period. Mr. Padilla replied that we are waiting to hear about the fencing within the next couple of weeks and we will have to see about the trees. Council President Gadaleta stated that we are also looking for a landscape who would like to donate their time to doing some landscaping at the causeway. Ms. Borrelli asked if we would still be doing the path around the lake. Councilwoman Margolis replied that we are still working on this. The causeway came first but we are still working on this project.

Nancy Gross, Woodcliff Lake, stated that she was happy to hear that the Mayor and Council had decided to consider all the various properties that we have in town for the different opportunities that we have for open space. It seemed to her that all the different ideas were in one spot, the Galaxy site. Ms. Gross asked what the follow-up might be and what the intention is now and where we are. She is also concerned about Resolution No. 22-197 regarding the hiring of Neglia for the engineering and surveying. Clearly there needs to be surveying no matter what but it seems a little bit like the cart before the horse unless you do know what the actual plans are. Mr. Padilla replied that we will require engineering services for whatever undertaking takes place at Galaxy. We did add a sentence to that Resolution under the resolve that it states that it is hereby approved subject to the final approval of scope of the project by the Governing Body. The full engineering cannot be undertaken until the Governing Body makes a final determination for Galaxy. Ms. Gross stated that it is super exciting to have Party City in town. Ms. Gross asked if the agreement with Party City will be put the website. Mr. Padilla stated that once it is approved, it will be put on the website.

Alex Couto, Woodcliff Lake, stated that he has been a long-time client of Party City in Paramus and he welcomes them to our town and is glad that they are here.

Bert Taylor, Woodcliff Lake, stated that after listening to the comments about the causeway, walkway, and galaxy gardens, we are coming closer to having plans for Galaxy Gardens. He is

hoping that we can do something about the corner of Galaxy Gardens and make it safe before opening the park at Galaxy Gardens. He and his wife had made numerous requests about putting a light at this corner.

MOTION to close to the public was made by Councilman Schnoll, second by Councilwoman Margolis and unanimously approved.

PARTY CITY PRESENTATION – led by Mayor Carlos Rendo

Mayor Rendo stated that it is with great pleasure to introduce Jason, Megan, and Jane. We have been working on this agreement for a year. It has been very pleasant meeting with the folks at Party City. Woodcliff Lake is extremely excited to have them in town. The company moving into town is required by the State of New Jersey to invest in a community benefits agreement with the town. After going back and forth, today comes the day that the Council has been given the Agreement to vote on. In essence, Party City will be contributing \$250,000 to the municipality over 10 years. That money will be used to pay off the bond that the Council is considering doing work on Galaxy Gardens. Part of the Agreement is that Party City will be actively involved in our community activities. Mr. Padilla stated that the NJ Merge program was created by the State. The agreement between Woodcliff Lake and Party City was the first one to be approved statewide. Mr. Padilla thanked the Party City team, Mayor Rendo, Councilman Schnoll, and some of the other folks on the committee but also the Bergen County Economic Development Corporation. This was a brand-new program and we all learned as we went along. Party City has also invested a great deal of funds in upgrading the facility. Mayor Rendo thanked the Party City Committee comprised of Councilman Richard Schnoll, Matt Berry, Rob Freidberg, and Mary Cummings.

Jason stated that the whole team has been fantastic. This is his first time doing this and it is a learning experience. They also won Office Deal of the Year in New Jersey that came out a couple of months ago. It has been a wonderful experience on his end. All the employees from top to bottom are really excited to be coming to Woodcliff Lake as is he since he has family and friends here as well. Megan stated that on behalf of everyone at Party City, they thank Mayor Rendo, Administrator Padilla and all the members of the Council who have invited them here today. They are thrilled to be here. Megan stated that Party City is not just a retailer, they are a global leader in the celebrations industry. Megan gave a bit of history about Party City and an overall description about their new headquarters. Jane thanked everyone since it was a new process for everyone. Council President Gadaleta thanked Party City for choosing Woodcliff Lake.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Rendo stated that there are people out there wondering what is going on with Fair Share Housing and 188 Broadway. We are still in litigation for 188 Broadway, but we are meeting with them and meeting with Fair Share Housing. We hope to have a solution by the end of the year.

MAYOR'S APPOINTMENT

Appointment of Raphael Maurrasse to the Board of Heath with a term expiring on December 31, 2023.

COUNCIL REPORTS

Councilman Falanga stated that overall the pool and camp has been going well this summer. We will give a more comprehensive report at our September meeting with details on membership with the camp and pool and how we did last year. We put the new pavilion at the pool and electric work will be done over the winter. The next big event coming up is our annual Oktoberfest which is taking place on October 1, 2022. Councilman Schnoll asked about the orange barrels at the pool. Councilman Falanga stated that we replastered the pool 2 years ago. We experienced problems the first year and the company came back to do some repairs and now unfortunately we are experiencing some problems again. We still have not paid the contractor their final payment from 2 years ago because we are holding that until they rectify the problem with the pool. It cannot be rectified during summer months because we want to keep the pool

open and filled with water. Once we drain the pool, we will look at it and make repairs.

Council President Gadaleta stated that several residents told her that they are happy with how the causeway is progressing. Council President Gadaleta stated that she was on a meeting regarding the air traffic noise, and it was discouraging. The towns are getting pushback because the pilots are customed using the current flight path and there is no incentive not to. They will continue to keep fighting the fight.

Councilwoman Hayes stated that she received a few phone calls regarding Galaxy Gardens over the past couple of weeks. There were some concerns regarding the number of dollars being spent. Another concern was the amphitheater and to the cost.

Councilwoman Margolis stated that we have a new tennis program starting at the tennis program on Wednesdays during the fall. We have had great enrollment so far. More information is on the website. When it is not leaf and snow season, DPW does a lot of clean-ups around the town. They have been busy with potholes, line striping, trimming shrubs, maintaining the fields including sprinkler, sewer maintenance, vehicle repairs and maintenance and they are getting ready for leaf pickup. Please check the collection schedule on the website. Also sign up for Recycle Coach. There is a shredding event coming in October. Do not flush anything in your sewer system besides what is meant to be there. Our DPW does an amazing job.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Administrator Padilla stated that there is a Resolution on the Agenda for a referendum regarding open space. The reason we are putting it back on is because we are adding another section that we did not do last time. This will allow us to use the open space money that comes in every year to offset or pay off the bond.

ORDINANCE NO. 22-08

NOTICE OF PENDING BOND ORDINANCE AND SUMMARY

The bond ordinance, the summary terms of which are included herein, was introduced and passed upon first reading at a meeting of the Borough Council of the Borough of Woodcliff Lake, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, on August 15, 2022. It will be further considered for final passage, after public hearing thereon, at a meeting of the Borough Council to be held in the Municipal Building, 188 Pascack Road, Woodcliff Lake, New Jersey, on September 19, 2022 at 7:00 P.M. During the week prior to and up to and including the date of such meeting copies of the full ordinance will be available, at no cost and during regular business hours, at the Clerk's office for the members of the general public who shall request the same. The summary of the terms of such bond ordinance follows:

<u>Title</u>: BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE MAKING OF VARIOUS PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS AND THE ACQUISITION OF NEW ADDITIONAL OR REPLACEMENT EQUIPMENT AND MACHINERY, NEW ADDITIONAL FURNISHINGS, NEW COMMUNICATION AND SIGNAL SYSTEMS EQUIPMENT, AND A NEW FIRE TRUCK AND A NEW AUTOMOTIVE VEHICLE, INCLUDING ORIGINAL APPARATUS AND EQUIPMENT, IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF WOODCLIFF LAKE, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$2,750,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

The purposes, appropriations and bonds/notes authorized in this multipurpose bond ordinance are as follows:

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR A MEETING NOT OPEN TO THE PUBLIC IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE NEW JERSEY OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12

RESOLUTION NO. 22-181 AUGUST 15, 2022

WHEREAS, the Borough of Woodcliff Lake is subject to certain requirements of the Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-6, et seq., and

WHEREAS, the Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12, provides that an Executive Session, not open to the public, may be held for certain specified purposes when authorized by Resolution; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Borough of Woodcliff Lake to discuss in a session not open to the public certain matters relating to the item or items authorized by N.J.S.A. 10:4-12b and designated below:

<u>1</u>. Matters Required by Law to be Confidential. Any matter which, by express provision of Federal law or State statute or rule of court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act.

_____2. Matters Where the Release of Information Would Impair the Right to Receive Funds. Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the Government of the United States.

_____3. Matters Involving Individual Privacy. Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned (or, in the case of a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly.

_____4. Matters Relating to Collective Bargaining Agreements. Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of the terms and conditions thereof with employees or representatives of employees of the public body.

_____5. Matters Relating to the Purchase, Lease or Acquisition of Real Property or the Investment of Public Funds. Any matter involving the purchase, lease or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds, where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed specifically with respect to _______. The minutes will be released on or before _______, 20___ when the issues pertaining to the property located at _______have been approved and finalized.

6. Matters Relating to Public Safety and Property. Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of violations of possible violations of the law.

X 7. Matters Relating to Litigation, Negotiations and the Attorney-Client Privilege, any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is required in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer, specifically with respect to: Contract Negotiations; Litigation Update

The minutes will be released in approximately ninety (90) days or upon the resolution through settlement or court decision and the time period for any and all appeals.

______8. Matters Relating to the Employment Relationship. Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance of promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all the individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting, specifically: personnel discussion.

The minutes will be released within ninety (90) days or earlier upon the resolution of the matter through settlement or court decision and the time period for any and all appeals.

_____9. Matters Relating to the Potential Imposition of a Penalty. Any deliberations of a public body occurring after a public hearing that may result in the imposition of a specific civil penalty upon the responding party or the suspension or loss of a license or permit belonging to the responding party bears responsibility.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Woodcliff Lake, assembled in public session on August 15, 2022 that an Executive Session closed to the public shall be held on August 15, 2022 at 6:00 P.M. at the Borough of Woodcliff Lake offices located at 188 Pascack Road, Woodcliff Lake, New Jersey, for the discussion of matters relating to the specific items designated above.

WHEREAS, the current continuation of the funding of the Open Space Trust Fund expired on December 31, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Woodcliff Lake desires that the public consider re-continuation of the current annual tax levy, by public referendum for a further seven (7) years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Woodcliff Lake, County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey that the following question shall be forwarded to the Bergen County Clerk for inclusion on the November 8, 2022 General Election ballot for consideration by the voters of the Borough of Woodcliff Lake:

BINDING QUESTION

() Yes. Shall the Borough of Woodcliff Lake continue an Open Space Trust Fund which will be funded in the following manner for the following purposes:

() No.

- A. The Open Space Trust Fund shall be funded through the collection of local property taxes in the following amount: \$0.01 per \$100.00 of assessed value per year for a period not to exceed seven (7) years.
- B. These funds shall be used for the purchase of open space so as to preserve such land as open space, and to keep said land in its natural state.
- C. If no open space is available for purchase, then the monies in said fund shall be used for such other passive recreation, conservation, farmland preservation or historic preservation purposes as may be permitted by law, to be determined following a public hearing.
- D. Open Space Trust Fund monies may also be used to pay debt service on indebtedness issued or incurred by the Borough for the purposes set forth in Section B and C above.

INTERPRETATIVE STATEMENT

This binding referendum will give the elected officials of Woodcliff Lake the sentiment of the voters concerning the continuation of Woodcliff Lake's Open Space Trust Fund. This Trust Fund was established in accord with the public's sentiment to authorize the acquisition of real property for open space purposes. The Borough Council will determine the yearly rate, which would be \$0.01 (one cent) for each one hundred (\$100) dollars of real property assessment. Therefore, as an example, the owner of a house assessed at \$767,962.00 (the average assessment of a home in the Borough) would pay a yearly open space tax that will not exceed \$77.00 each year. An affirmative vote would allow the Borough to continue to collect this special levy for a period of seven (7) years, at which time the Governing Body would again submit a proposition for public referendum. If open space is not available for purchase, the monies in the Fund would be used for such other passive recreation, conservation, farmland preservation or historic preservation purposes as may be permitted by law, to be determined following a public hearing. Open space monies may also be used to pay debt service on Borough indebtedness incurred for any of the authorized purposes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Woodcliff Lake, that the Bergen County Clerk is hereby requested to print the binding referendum and interpretative statement on the official ballot for the General Election to be held November 8, 2022.
